In my artistic practice, I aim to create aesthetically pleasing and thought-provoking visuals. Growing up in a small city in southern Egypt, my introduction to art was always intertwined with societal and community integration. This perspective has shaped my artistic practice in a way that always aims to interact with my community. Through my imagery, I take the opportunity to highlight societal nuances, provoke dialogue, and strive to effect positive change in our collective reality. Curiosity is the driving force behind my artistic expression. I constantly seek to tell visual stories that stem from my society, stories that can teach and inform me and others, stories I can share with the wider public, specifically stories that are often overlooked or unspoken. From the Nile banks in my hometown in Egypt and along the Nile line in Africa reaching to the Mediterranean, water and people's relation to it have been major elements in my work. Using documentary photography, community engagement, and scientific collaboration, I search for stories that encourage us to view water and our environment differently. I am open to employing various methods and mediums to tell these stories more effectively and to communicate with a broader audience. In my recent research, I embrace the role of a mythmaker through storytelling and the use of myth and rituals as away that can be used in environmental conservation.

"Stomata" is a spiritual journey driven by my fascination with water. It explores the diverse surfaces and depths of water, including microscopic observations and the remarkable plants that rely on it. Stomata, tiny openings on leaves and stems, play a crucial role in gas exchange and water regulation for plants. They enable photosynthesis, allowing carbon dioxide in and releasing oxygen. Moreover, stomata act as guardians, regulating the loss of water vapor through the intricate mechanism of transpiration. In moments of reflection, don't we all need our own "stomata"? Just as plants embrace the balance of gas exchange and water conservation.
